

For Parents: Teaching Idioms

Before starting this lesson, explain to your child what an Idiom is.

Idioms are the phrases we use, when the actual words mean something else.

Talk about this with your child.

Use the example: “I’m all ears”.

Does “I’m all ears” mean I am made from ears?

That is so silly! 😊

I’m all ears doesn’t mean I am made of ears, but that I’m listening.

Use the Idioms list to discuss more examples.

After discussion, the child can do the activity.
